

From Sarah Brown McCulloch's *Guilford: A Walking Guide* (2012):

Knapp Foundry, 200 Boston Street, 1913.

Originally a garage and automobile dealership, it was built and operated by George Edwin Hull and his sons Herbert Pickering Hull and Sherman Bishop Hull. They sold Dodge and Chalmer cars and provided service for Hupmobiles and Studebakers, and their reputation for excellent work drew customers from miles around. It became a foundry in c1944 and was altered extensively but the limestone sills and brick corbeling at the cornice line survived. In 1988 remodeling was begun for use as condominiums.
