Dr. John Redfield, 47 Broad Street, Colonial, 1768.

Originally this house stood on Park Street where, sometime in the nineteenth century, it acquired a Greek Revival doorway and later a Victorian porch along the entire front. In 1937 it was taken down in pieces to make room for the town hall parking lot. The pieces were saved in bundles and in 1942 the house was rebuilt here without the porch. An unusually steep roof allows space for two windows in the attic level of the gable. The rear section is a twentieth-century addition. Dr. John Redfield built another house twelve years after he built this one. For more about him, see 1 Park Street described in the walk around the Green.
