A unique and vivid building, the clarity of the strong geometric form and the jutting overhang of the roof emphasized by the smooth flushboarding of the walls and by spanking white paint and dark green trim. The overhanging eaves and arched gable window suggest at first glance the

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

Italianate style. But the two-bay facade is un-expected, and the wide arched window is not really Italianate. Is it possible that the building began as a barn or ware-

house with a hoist in the gable window? Or is this an example of spontaneous vernacular design? In any case, it is a famous local landmark and an arresting sight amid the clutter of the Post Road. Edwin A. Leete operated a funeral parlor in the house next door on the corner, and this building originally was a shop where caskets and furniture were made. Today it is still a furniture shop and still attached to the house next door, now an antiques store

(see 98 Fair Street).
