Two early plank doors and strap hinges remain in the rear wing, also a well now enclosed in the rear porch. 8/12 sash on front.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL An interesting and puzzling house which has evidently been periodically either modernized or restored by many owners over the last two hundred years or so. Much original work is well preserved inside. The rear section appears older than the front, and perhaps this is the part the ascribed date of 1744 refers to, for the low pitch of the roof of the front section seems unlikely for such a period. It even seems surprising for 1775. The Doric doorway is a still later addition (probably c1840) which has recently lost its onetime projecting porch and columns (c1972). 20th century extensions to the rear and on the west side.
