

7. ALTERATIONS

East and rear wings added. The posts of the entry porch are Queen Anne; possibly the roof is original.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

This house looks particularly well in its setting, on ample grounds with big trees and with barns out back. Combined with Bishop's big farm market across the street, it gives this brief stretch of the Post Road a special accent.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

A typical Federal house, with tall paired chimneys and a pretty fanlight over the door. Inside, the central hall plan has been altered. but much original work remains--doors, mantels, chair rails. Barns out back.

Located across the road from Bishop's barn, orchards, and stand, this is the farmhouse to which the original Bishop farm belonged. It was lived in by Walter Bishop next by his son, Burton, and now by the widow of Burton's son Charles. See 1355 Boston Post Road.
