8. NOTABLE FEATURES

The triple central window was a gesture of elegance in Federal Guilford. This is one of half a dozen or so in town.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

A nicely-detailed house that has been well preserved. The porch and leaded fanlight are Late 18th century in form, simple but delicate in scale. 12/12 sash enhances the overall crispness. The house is said to have a secret compartment under the floor of a closet, but history unfortunately does not record who or what was hidden there. John B. Chittenden, son of Abraham Chittenden, was a deacon of the First Church. He moved to Illinois not long after building his house.
