7. ALTERATIONS Rear additions. The chimney is evidently rebuilt and the fine slate roof, almost unique in Guilford, is probably late 19th century. On its former site, where it had been an office building, the house had a pair of bay windows on each side of the front door. These were changed

8. NOTABLE FEATURES back to reproductions of the original windows at the time of the move. The doorway looks as if it too may have had a history: first a Greek Revival frame with a flat top was probably added sometime around 1840, and then perhaps, about a

century later, a Colonial enthusiast Georgianized 9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL it with the pediment. This house is notable for its vigorous steep lines and modillioned cornice

and frieze. Since the photograph above was taken (1981), it has been painted dark grey and false shutters have been added, and attractive landscaping.

Nathaniel Bishop was a farmer and also a sea captain engaged in the West Indies trade, where he accumulated considerable wealth. At the time of his death in 1769 the house was not yet finished.
