It is hard to believe that this house of traditional Colonial form with standard Greek Revival doorway was built as late as 1870, but the date is thoroughly documented. The New Haven <u>Palladium</u> wrote in 1879, "In a new house that sprouted up in 1870 from the old one lives J.W. Norton, one of those eminently square men sure to be burdened with cares of state and church." The square Mr. Norton, a deacon of the church, evidently liked things just the way they always had been. He tore down an older house on the site in order to build this one, and re-used some of the materials. Windows and doors were handmade by the builder, Carlton Parmelee.
