9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

A classic of the Greek Revival, with main cornice drawn across the facade to form a pediment, with two flanking symmetrical wings, and an exceptionally splendid Doric door distinguished by a dentil course under the cornice and handsomely patterned sidelights. Gable window also handsomely patterned. Aluminu siding covers other trim, but judging by what is seen, the house is detailed with nicety. The flamboyantly overscaled side porch may have been added about ten years later at the time that Weld was building the house next door, for the two porches are nearly (but not quite) the same.

William Weld was Guilford's top builder throughout the whole of the antebellum period. This was his own house and is still owned by the family.
