8. NOTABLE FEATURES

The door, which is probably a Greek Revival addition of sometime around 1840, is delightful--modest but elegant, with a simple row of little blocks like Greek guttae at the top of each pilaster, and a delicate cornice.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

A house in this neighborhood that has not been covered with synthetic siding and shiny silver window sash is a welcome sight. With its gambrel roof and austere simplicity, this is one of the striking buildings on the street. The first Methodist sermon preached in Guilford, we are told, was preached here, in 1789 by the Reverend Jesse Lee.
