7. ALTERATIONS

In 1842 the roof line was altered making the roof less steep and adding an overhang; also the Greek Revival portico was added; new chimney.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Overhanging eaves; a very slight overhang on the gable end at the first floor level; Greek Revival portico with fluted columns, wide frieze, and sidelights flank the door.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL The alteration in the roof of this Colonial house changes the overall look of the house. However, close examination reveals the slight overhang on the gable is evidence of the true age of the house. The Greek Revival portico with its fluted columns is similar to a number of porticos in Guilford known to have been done This house and its immediate neighbors are situatby William Weld. ed behind a fine series of connecting picket fences.

Reuben and Caleb Stone, sons of Caleb, inherited

shares in the ownership of Faulkner's Island in 1761. They later sold these sharescirca 1800. Reuben Stone made two trips to New Haven and one to Hartford to arrange procurement of provisions for Guilford's Revolutionary soldiers. He was reimbursed for this travel on 12 April 1779.
