Arched window on west side appears to be an interpolation. Aluminum siding and false shutters, the latter smaller than the generously proportioned windows.
8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Notable especially for its ample scale, matched by only three or four others in town at this date. Fine basement of large granite blocks; elaborate porch with paired fluted columns (possibly later?); monitor with finial still intact.
9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

The house is described by Mary Hoadley Griswold as "a stately mansion" and does indeed have a commanding presence in a key location on the Green at the head of Whitfield Street. It was later occupied by Tuttle's sister-in-law, Clara Sage, a well-known local philanthropist whose bequest was instrumental in building the Guilford Library in 1933.
