9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

This four bay house of the Federal period stands on one of the main thoroughfares leading into the center of Guilford. This house is representative of a form used in Guilford before the 1830's. This house was built for his bride by William Starr, Jr., who married on 31 January 1827, Amelia Chittenden. The Guilford-Durham Turnpike had just been built. It had cut off the west side of the Starr property on State Street, land that had been held by the Starr family since 1694.
