Overhanging eaves; boxed cornice; frieze; 6/6 sash; large rocks for the foundation.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

Originally built on the corner of Goose Lane and Clapboard Hill, it was moved to the top of the hill in 1851 and then moved again the following year to is present site. Students attended this school from 1835 until 1931 when the consolidation of several schools brought about its closing. It is now private property. Its story has been written by Joel E.
