SIGNIFICANCE

- 9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL One of the earliest dated examples of a Greek Revival house in Guilford, still carrying a Federal half-moon window in the gable and transom lights over the door. The screened porch across the front probably began as an open verandah, perhaps around 1875-85, and later lost its brackets and fancy work when the screening was added. For an account of George Bushnell, the builder, see 205 Clapboard Hill Road.
