## 8. NOTABLE FEATURES

**Buildings & Structures** 

Overhanging eave, twelve over twelve sash, six over six in gable, doorway with six pane transom, moulding around door.

9 ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL One of the early Dudley houses on Clapboard Hill. This house has the usual features of a story and a half Colonial house. There is also, however, a high gable window which is unusual. The house has a lean-to at the rear; it is not known whether it is part of the original house.

This house was built by Abraham Dudley who was the brother of Caleb Dudley, III (see 212 Clapboard Hill). Abraham was a weaver who worked with his sons. Their shop was originally located west of the house, later it was moved to the rear of the house.
