The quarter-mile where Clapboard Hill Road drops down to cross the wide marshes of the East River is one of Guilford's enchanted places. This classic Greek Revival house is situated on a rise above the river, its pure white form and well-maintained grounds and garden complimenting the rich colors and wild growth of the wetlands, much of which is now safely in the hands of the Audubon Society thanks to the owners of the house. In the actual design of the house there is nothing exceptional. tional. But the combination of impeccable maintenance and a sensitive appreciation of the relationship between building and land make this one of Guilford's most important sites.
