12/12 sash; simple moulding around windows and door; door and window sharing common jamb; plank house.

## 9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

This small house built to house a coachman, possibly a slave, is understandably simple. However, in its simplicity there is great charm. The house has been carefully restored and the addition does not detract from the original.

This was the coachman's house, originally two rooms, of Dr. David Brooks, North Guilford physician, who moved to New York. He died in 1826. J.S. Stevens purchased the place in 1839 and his family occupied the building for the next century as a home, cobbler shop and barber shop. In 1939, it was restored and a kitchen and dining room were added. A bedroom wing was added in 1959.
