• Interrelationship of building and surroundings:

This property consists of 1.04 acres of land on the west side of Durham Road. A horseshoe driveway extends off the road to the east of the house. A secondary driveway extends to the west off the road and terminates at a parking area to the north of the house. To the northwest of the house is a barn. This property sits on the corner of Durham Road and Old Barn Lane. Less than a mile to the north is Bitner Park. Surrounding the property are twentieth century dwellings.

• Other notable features of building or site (Interior and/or Exterior)

This is a two-story dwelling with an attic and a side-gable roof. The house is sheathed in aluminum siding and the roof is covered in asphalt shingles. The eaves of the roof have a slight overhang. The three-bay facade faces east, and the main entry is centered on this side. It is reached by stairs and leads into an enclosed porch with a shed-roof. (See continuation sheet)

• Historical or Architectural importance:

This dwelling was originally owned by Charles Monti (also spelled Monte), Sr. and was built c. 1933. John Rebuzzini acquired property on the east side of Durham Road (including this property) in 1907. In 1923 he sold 17 acres of his land on the east side of Durham Road (including this property) to Peter Monte, Charles Monti's father. An earlier house on the property, the Justin Lee house, burned in 1932. This dwelling at 1092 Durham Road was built directly behind where the Justin Lee house stood. Charles Monti was a poultry farmer. He owned the property until the 1950s when he sold it to Edwin J. Tichy, Sr. Edwin Joseph Tichy was born in Rockland, Connecticut in 1915 to Frank J. Tichy, an Austrian immigrant, and Mollie A. Seifert. (See continuation sheet)

Other notable features of building or site

Fenestration consists of one-over-one and six-over-one double-hung sash windows. An addition is attached to the west elevation of the house, and a deck is attached to the south elevation.

Historical or Architectural importance

He married Frieda Adele Hinners in 1938 in North Guilford. Edwin J. Tichy worked for the Grain and Hardware Company in Clinton, Connecticut. He also had a poultry business, according to the 1963 City Directory of Guilford. Edwin Tichy raised up to 40,000 chickens at one time and sold the eggs. When the chickens were too old to lay, he sold them to the Campbell's Soup Company. Frieda Tichy died in 1995 and Edwin J. Tichy died in 1997. In 1995, the property was sold to David and Deborah Yeager.
