8. NOTABLE FEATURES The most notable feature, which no one passing on the road can fail to be struck by, is the beautiful presence of the house on its land. Placed on a slope that rises above the road, with a great sweep of open hillside behind it, filled with light, the house itself stands in a green shade 9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL under great trees. A white picket fence delineates the broad lawn, and big weathered barns stand to one side. This is one of Guilford's most gracious places.

The main section of the house was probably built around 1840-like many Guilford houses a conservative mixture of the old Colonial-Federal building tradition (pitched roof and five-bay facade) with the new accessories of the Greek Revival, principally the free-standing Doric entry porch. Later in the 19th century, presumably, the south wing was added (the arched window suggests a date around the Civil War), but in 1905, according to the owner, the north section was built. This section follows the detailing of the original faithfully, and the group as a whole forms an interesting and satisfying composition.
