9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

The Greek Revival style was much favored by the old established families of North Guilford, newly prosperous in the Ante-Bellum years and eager to replace the old-fashioned and inconvenient houses of their grandfathers with something more modern—but not too much so. There are a great many houses of this type scattered around the countryside. Exceptionally well maintained, this one still has a fence out front, a row of great trees, and an air of crispness and tidiness that was a part of the style.

Lucerne Rossiter, owner of this property according to the 1868 Map, was a prominent North Guilford resident. He entertained the

South School children here in 1877.
