9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

The style of this house is ambiguous. The Doric doorway is unmistakably Greek Revival, and so is the broad frieze under the overhang of the roof. But the height is unusual for the period, suggesting a later date. And the square window in the gable with its eared surround recalls decorative work by the prominent New Haven architect, Henry Austin. There is little of his work in Guilford, and it is surprising to find this small isolated fragment way up here in the country.

J.S. Chittenden is identified as the owner of this property on the 1852 map.
