- Interrelationship of building and surroundings:

This property consists of 0.25 acres of land on the south side of Edwards Street. A driveway extends to the south off the road and terminates in front of (to the north of) the garage. The garage is to the southeast of the house. The property is near the corner of Edwards Street and Dohm Avenue (to the northeast. Less than a mile to the south is Nut Plains Cemetery and a mile to the northwest is Guilford Lakes Elementary School. (See continuation sheet)

- Other notable features of building or site (Interior and/or Exterior)

This is a one-story, side-gable Colonial Revival cape style dwelling. It is sheathed in aluminum siding with asphalt shingles on the roof. A chimney protrudes from the center of the ridgeline of the roof. The facade faces north and the main entry is centered on this side. It is reached by concrete stairs with no railings. An addition is attached to the west elevation of the house. Fenestration includes one-over-one double-hung windows with shutters.

Architect _____ Builder Edward Dohm (Helander)

- Historical or Architectural importance:

According to a 1948 Developer's Map found at the Town Clerk's office, this house was built after the map was created. This street was developed by Edward and Anna Dohm in the late-1940s. The houses were built between 1947-1956 (Helander). Originally this subdivision was named "Ridgecroft," but it is now known by residents as "Dohmville." The owners of this property in 1948 was Harry and Patricia Dodge. Harry Louis Dodge, Jr. was born in Guilford in 1912 to Harry and Effie Garrett Dodge. He married Patricia Daboll in 1945 in Florida. He was employed at the Journal Courier in New Haven, and was an Army Veteran of World War II. Harry Dodge died in 1993 at the age of 81 and is buried in the Nut Plains Cemetery.
