This two story frame house has a back ell with 9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL a two story bay window topped with a ballistrade. Windows on the first floor are tall and double windows appear on the front on both the first and second floors. Arched windows are found on the second floor of the bay window and in the gable ends at the attic level. The gable ends have brackets and decorative bargeboards and are topped with a finial. The front porch wraps around three sides of the house and the roof is supported by thin turned posts, scroll work forms an open frieze. The house sits on a slight rise and the yard is defined by a picket fence.

Ira Ives Fenn Dudley (1849-1927) descendant of founding families, farmer, active member North Guilford Congregational Church, distinguished resident was original owner of this house; inherited by son John.
