False windows (middle front facade, first and second story); wide frieze; moulding above the frieze at the eave line; wide overhanging eaves; fanciful porch posts and trim.

A good example of the Italianate style in Guilford; the restrained, yet unique porch trim shows a higher level of sophistication of the builder than is evident in other villas built in the town.
