8. NOTABLE FEATURES

8/12 sash except the gable window (6/6); wide board covering the sill of the house.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

This Colonial house has a five bay facade and a center chimney. The simple form of the house accentuates the wide sill board, and the wide window frames. The Greek Revival doorway, a later alteration, has an extremely broad entablature. This house is a fine example of 18th century Guilford architecture and an integral part of the outstanding streetscape on Fair Street.
