8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Overhanging eaves with a boxed cornice; 8/12 sash on the second story and 12/12 sash on the first floor.

The wide overhang and the steep roof are 9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL characteristic of Guilford houses of the early part of the eighteenth century. This substantial house and its location on one of the village's important streets reflect the prominence of its builder, Nathaniel Johnson. The Greek Revival doorway was added in the mid nineteenth century, something done frequently in Guilford.

Nathaniel Johnson and his brother, Samuel, sons of Samuel and Mary nee Sage, were the two founders of the Church of England in Guilford. Samuel received holy orders in England in 1722. Nathaniel joined the Church sometime before 1738. Samuel had a distinguished career in the ministry and as first president of King's College, now Columbia University (1753-63) continued...
