Substantial addition to the rear southside; screened in porch first floor; room on second floor; solar panels; Fenestration altered on the rear ell.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Board and batten siding, wide over hanging eaves; 6/6 sash. Carriage house at rear with board and batten siding decorative bargeboards; quatrefoil window in gable

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

This is an outstanding example of the Gothic Revival style. The illusion of stone is achieved by the porch parapet and the heavy hoodmolds. "With its strong Puritan background and Colonial heritage, Guilford was not easily seduced by the pictoresque fantasies of the Gothic cottages so popular elsewhere from the 1840's on." This house was built by James Monroe who also built 53 Fair Street.
