Two front bay windows; second "floor" windows; frieze on both sides of building.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Strong pediment; large corner pilasters; Greek Revival door frame; wide frieze: a slightly arched gabel window; bellfry.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL The North West Central School is one of the strongest Greek Revival buildings in Guilford. One of the most notable features is the wide corner pilasters which are rare in Guilford. The school has a full pediment and very wide frieze board. A square, flat topped bellfry sits near the front of the building. Little appears to have changed in comparison to an early photograph (c1880); the gable window was originally a vent and the doorway had a portico. There were no windows where the modern bay windows are now located.

Built in 1848, students from this district of the Town's center attended this one-room school until 1871 when several schools were consolidated into the Union School District. (continued)
