8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Boxed cornice with returns; frieze with a moulding below; rectangular gable window with decorative muntins; doorway with pilasters and an entablature; stone foundation.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

This house has features typical of Guilford's Greek Revival houses such as the broad rectangular gable window, the boxed cornice with returns, and a doorway with pilasters. A long wing stretching left from the house adds to its substantial appearance. By 1840, according to a topographical map, a wing was already part of the house.

This was the house of John Benton, along with his brother, Dan, was an important buyer and seller of land in Guilford. The house is an important part of a semi-rural neighborhood near much residential development.
