Addition to the rear: fenestration altered on the side.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Slightly overhanging eaves with a moulding below; 6/6 sash; doorway with a six pane transom, and an architrave trim above the transom; field stone foundation.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

This is a well-proportioned house of the Federal period. central doorway has an interesting treatment with a transom surmounted by architrave trim suggesting capitals. A very similar doorway is found at 246 Goose Lane. A stone embankment and picket fence surround a lawn that makes a fine setting for one of Guilford's smaller houses of the Federal period.

William Dudley, one of the sons of Amos Dudley the builder, built this house. Deacon Richard Bartlett once lived

here as did Ayres Stevens, a basketmaker
