SIGNIFICANCE

8. NOTABLE FEATURES
Moulding along the eave; asymmetrical facade; 12/12 sash on front facade; 8/12 sash on the sides; doorway with a crown moulding, a five pane transom; stone chimney; stone foundation.
9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL
Its asymmetrical window placement is an interesting feature of this house. The windows and transom are composed of small panes appropriate to the Colonial era. A large center stone chimney dominates the roof line. Shade trees and picket fence enhance this house, which is a very important part of its semi-rural environment.
David Naughty II, son of Peter, was the nephew of David I, a merchant from Boston who bought the property once held by Samuel Baldwin, the blacksmith, on the east side of the Green. David I died in 1739 leaving his widow and David II co-executors of his estate.
