• Interrelationship of building and surroundings:

This property consists of 0.19 acres of land on the south side of High Street. A driveway extends south off the road and terminates at a parking area on the northeast of the house. The property is just to the west of the intersection of High Street and Whitfield Street. Less than half a mile to the northwest is the Guilford Green. Surrounding this property are nineteenth and early twentieth century dwellings.

• Other notable features of building or site (Interior and/or Exterior)

This is a two-story Greek Revival style dwelling with an attic and a front-gable roof with slightly overhanging eaves. The house is vernacular in style and sheathed in clapboard siding. The roof is covered in asphalt shingles and the foundation is made of stone. The three-bay facade faces north, and the main entry is on this side. It is reached by stone steps and is protected from the elements by a gable-roof that is supported by slender brackets. (See continuation sheet)

• Historical or Architectural importance:

The original owner of this dwelling was Lucius Dudley and it was built in 1870. Dudley was born in Guilford in 1818 to Amos Dudley (1771-1843) and Sarah Evarts (1779-1845). He married Clarissa A. Parmelee (1819-1899) in 1842. They had five children: Walter Russell Dudley (1839-1893), Ellen Augusta Dudley (1842-1880), Margaret Clarissa Dudley (1849-1881), Edward Lucius Dudley (1850-1937), and Richard Carver Dudley (1855-1940). Lucius Dudley died in 1887 and is buried in Fairport, Monroe County, New York. Later owners of the property were J. S. Mack and Lewis Coulter.

### Other notable features of building or site

Greek Revival features include the overhanging eaves, the symmetrical façade, the front-gable orientation, the wide fascia board, molding on the corners and bottom of the house, and the slightly decorative features of the window trim. Fenestration consists of six-over-six double-hung sash windows. A decorative rectangular window is in the attic of the façade. An addition is on the south elevation of the house.
