DESCRIPTION

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Long cornice; rectangular bay window on the side; double-arched windows in the gable; doorway; rock faced stone foundation.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

This house with heavy cornice and its round top gable windows combines elements of the late Greek Revival and the Italianate styles. The house is quite large and its features quite bold. The doorway is similar to several others in the neighborhood. Edmund S. Jillson served as a musician in the 1st Infantry Regiment N.Y. V. during the Rebellion. From 1866 until 1869, he held property on State Street where he ran a meat market. In 1896, when he was elected Constable, Jillson owned a house on Boston Street.
