8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Rear brick ell on the south side (original); corbeled brick along the eave line and in the gable; stone lintels; 8/8 sash (probably new); remains of tie rods.

This site has long been associated with manufactur-9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL ing in Guilford; a brass factory and lock works It was the first of a series of companies that, began here in 1850. before the end of the 19th century, manufactured school furniture, "vegetable ivory" goods, novelties, hubs, spokes, and wheels.

The brick building now on the site seems to be one built for the Guilford Enterprise Company after their older building burned down in May 1884. The Company, in addition to working with "vegetable ivory" (celluloid?), was incorporated to manufacture and sell goods of wood, ivory, metal, composition, or rubber.

The main building is a gable-roofed two-story brick block four bays deep and eleven bays wide. Stone lintels and brick corbels add their restrained decorative touch. Numerous additions to the rear have enlarged the space (cont'd. on next sheet)
