Shell Beach is part of Leete's Island, land granted to Governor William Leete 1667-8 by the Town. The area "probably remained a horse pasture" until Deacon Pelatiah Leete I, his grandson, settled here about 1706. Leete's descendants still hold land in the area as does the Town. The summer colony, which developed with the railroad and then automobile, has become "year -round" in many houses of this sort.
