Side addition with a screened porch; some 2/2 sash in 1908.

Semi-elliptical fanlight in the gable; 12/12 sash; 8. NOTABLE FEATURES crown mouldings over windows; doorway with decorative recessed panel pilasters; an entablature, and a decorative panel door.

## 9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

A not quite ellipitical fanlight in a pedimented gable facing the street is a feature this house shares with a few other houses in Guilford (see nos. 2548 and 2734 Long Hill Road). This house has a doorway with recessed panel pilasters. Small plantings permit an open view of this house, an example of the early 19th century rural houses of this district. The property is enhanced by two barns, one said to date from very early in the 18th century when Pelatiah Leete I, the first settler of Leete's Island, established his farm and built his first home on this lot. Members of the Leete family still live in this house built by Edward Lorenzo Leete.
