- Interrelationship of building and surroundings:

This property consists of 1 acre of land on the east side of Long Hill Road. A horseshoe shaped driveway extends to the east off the road, just to the north of the house. A shed is located to the northeast of the house. Trees line the south border of the parcel. The property sits at the intersection of Long Hill Road, Bullard Drive, and Gamma Avenue. Directly to the east, located on Bullard Drive, is Baldwin Middle School. (See continuation sheet)

- Other notable features of building or site (Interior and/or Exterior)

This is a two-story dwelling with a front-gable roof. The roof is covered in asphalt shingles. The house is vernacular in style and sheathed in vinyl siding. The façade faces west atop a raised foundation. The main entry is a simple door in the south half of the façade, beside a four-light bay window. A side-by-side double hung window pair is centered in the second story gable. A louvered vent is centered in the attic above.

- Historical or Architectural importance:

This dwelling was originally owned by Frederick W. Elliot and was built c. 1880. The house was built for a hired man and was moved from 2131 Long Hill Road. Frederick Wyllys Elliot (spelled Eliot in the Shore Line Times Obituary as well as numerous Ancestry.com records including Military, death, and family trees) was born in North Guilford in 1860 to Harvey and Jane (Coulter) Eliot. In 1891 Elliot married Matilda Mathison and had two children: Frederick W. Elliot and Marguerite Elliot. In the 1910 United States Federal Census of Guilford, Frederick Elliot was listed as a dairy farmer. Elliot suffered from "creeping palsy" and died in 1921. For years, his children took care of him. He was buried in Alderbrook Cemetery. Later owners of the property were Alfons Emonts and P. Glebocki.
