Boxed cornice with returns; moulding under the eaves; 8. NOTABLE FEATURES frieze; cupola with wide overhanging eaves; paired arched windows, and a finial; double arched gable windows; wide lintel boards over the windows; double mouldings around the door frame topped with a frieze and cornice; brick foundation.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL
The cupola atop this house is its most remarkable feature. Its arched windows and overhanging eaves echo those of the house; it not only unifies the house but reminds us that its builder felt its surrounding of rolling fields were worth more than a casual glance. They still are and so is this house, a very elegant example of the Italianate form and one of the few houses in Guilford with a cupola.

The H. Elliot (or Elliott) who built this house, may have been a son of the distinguished North Guilford physician, Harvey, a Yale graduate, who died in New York City. Most likely he is none other than the Harvey Elliott of North Guilford who was elected

a fence viewer in 1879.
