7. ALTERATIONS
Rear-side addition (1952); rear dormer and overhang (1942); shingle siding.

## 8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Three bay facade (with a door and a window sharing a common jamb); moulded eaves with a moudling below the eaves; narrow frieze; 12/12 sash in the third floor and in the second floor lean-to portion; paneled door; stone foundation and chimney.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

A "half-house" - a typical "saltbox" except that the portion at one side of the chimney was mitted, presumably to be added later. The house faces East, a lean-to at the north of the chimney may have preceded the main house. The interior was extensively remodeled in the early Federal period. The exterior, originally clapboards, is now shingled.

The front or east wall slopes outward at an angle of about 3 presumably to shed rain better. This is an original feature of the house, not an aging effect. The ceiling heights are: ground floor 9'-5": second floor 9'-0".

Probably built by and certainly occupied by Philemon Hall, a captain in the Revolution (cont'd. on next sheet)

who inherited the property from his father, John Hall (1706-1790). Philemon, born 1733, married Sarah Pape in 1756 - their son, Thomas and his wife, Lydia Hoppin, also lived here. His son, Joel, sold it in 1818.

J. Frederick Kelly measured the house inside and outside and photographed it shortly before his death. In 1942, the rear dormer and overhang were added over the back door. The large ell was added in 1952-53. Both additions were by Walter Beckwith, carpenter, and his son who told the owners there were no nail holes in the planks between the main house and the small ell shown in 1922 photographs by Snyder.
