8. NOTABLE FEATURES Pedimented cornice; mutules and guttae decorate the eaves and raking; curved fanlight in the gable; 12/12 sash; doorway with thin tapered pilasters, bosses, mutules and guttae and a four pane transom; dressed granite block foundation (no mortar used).

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

The trim along the eaves and gable of this house as well as its doorway are elements of the style of the Federal period. Its placement with its gable end toward the street is more typical of the later Greek Revival. The combination of features make it an interesting example of stylistic transition.
