8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Boxed cornice with returns; rectangular gable window (maybe c1840); stone and brick foundation.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

This is a well proportioned house of the early 19th century that has acquired new features like small chimneys and shingle siding as it was adapted to the changing needs of the practical farmers who lived there. Some of its cluster of barns are said to date back to the 18th century; others were moved here shortly after the Civil War. Although it is no longer operating as a dairy farm, it is virtually complete milk-producing farm complex, a very rare survival from Guilford's agricultural past.

The Rev. William Vaill and his wife bought this house, for their use while he was pastor of the North Guilford Congregational Church in 1809.
