9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

Overhangs at the front and sides clearly delineate the second and third stories of this large house. A Greek Revival doorway with a plain frieze and pilasters fits in well with the earlier features. A picket fence and plantings enhance the house, a very good example of the later 18th century houses of North Guilford.

The house was built for Dr. David S. Brooks, a North Guilford physician who moved to New York. It was acquired by the Rossiter family in 1822 and remained in this family until 1960.
