8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Overhanging eaves and raking; plain bargeboard and visible rafter ends; brick chimney; 6/1 sash; symmetrically placed hipped roof dormers; porch with round columns supporting a hipped roof and a simple balustrade.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

Broad sloping roofs and hip-roofed dormers are distinctive features that make this house appear close to the ground. It is unusual for a house of this style to be found near the center of Guilford; bungalows are more common in the suburban and vacation areas of town.

This house was built by Henry Blatchley Beckwith, a house builder in partnership with his sons, Irving and Walter. They also built the adjacent house to the east, which may have been a store originally - Walter's son, George, still resides here.
