7. ALTERATIONS

Rear addition (attached by a hall); Greek Revival doorway with pilasters, entablature, and sidelights.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

8/12 sash; 6/6 sash in the gable; large stone chimney; stone foundation.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL The wide spacing of the five windows of the facade are a noteworthy feature of this Colonial house, an excellent example of the mid 18th century with few changes since. A Greek Revival doorway is an addition common to many of Guilford's Colonial houses. This doorway is especially large, with sidelights as well as the usual pilasters and entablature. A secluded setting with a pond make important contributions of the site of this house.

Benjamin Fowler, probably the same man who later owned this house, was a grand juror of the Town, January 1729. A sergeant by this name and a Benjamin Fowler, Jr. fought in the French and Indian Wars.
