Overhanging eaves and rafters; decorative shingles in the gable; wrap around porch with decorative posts, brackets, and a scallop trim on the eaves; large stone block foundation.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

The narrow width of the elements of this cross-gabled house give it an appearance of verticality. Decorative eaves and shingled gables also draw attention upward. It is an example of the Town's Queen Anne style houses of moderate size.

Ellsworth N. Leete, son of Richard M., was born in 1866. He married Anna B. Fowler in 1889 and acquired this property in 1892. Leete was active in Democratic politics; he was nominated Town Clerk in 1897 and a delegate to the Party's State Convention in 1896.
