7. ALTERATIONS

Side porch (screened); window sash.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Frieze; rectangular gable window; doorway with pilasters and an entablature; stone foundation.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL The three-bay front, rectangular window in a gable end set off with a boxed cornice with returns, and a doorway with pilasters and an entablature make this an excellent example of the Greek Revival style. Furthermore, it is important as a documented piece of the work of Willam E. Weld, builder of many of the town's houses in the middle of the 19th century.

Weld built the house for Ambrose Ward Leete in 1839-40. Leete married Abigail M. Leete in February 1840. They occupied the house until it was sold to Rufus N. Leete in 1863. Ambrose and

his wife then moved to a house on Fair Street.
