8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Decorative bargeboards; turret with flaired eaves and beveled glass in the windows; eyebrow window; small square post porch.

A variety of roof shapes encompass this small two-story house; conical roof over the squat tower, gambrel over the main portion of the house, and the broad sweep of the flaring porch roof becomes a gable roof where it extends beyond the house. An eyebrow window appears in the upper part of the gambrel roof and a flaring gable roof dormer window is below it. A large Palladian-like window is placed in the second floor of the tower. The bargeboards are decorated with a circular motif and wooden shingles cover the roof and tower. The house sits alone on a small island connected to the mainland by a substantial granite causeway. The house was located near the quarry.

The house was built in 1899 by Peter Beattie, son of John Beattie who opened up the Leete's Island Quarries in 1870. Following his father's death in 1899 Peter ran the business It folded during WWI.
