7. ALTERATIONS

Cross gable projection (with beveled sides); 6/2 sash; rear addition.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Wide lintel boards over the window; doorway with pilaster; an entablature (with dentils under the cornice); and sidelights (with decorative muntins).

The hilltop setting of this house, overlooking 9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL the head of the East River at the Guilford Lakes, inspired successive owners to enlarge and embellish it. Originally this was a Greek Revival house with an impressive entryway; a bevelsided projection opened the house for a better view across the valley later in the 19th century. A wall of rounded stones, probably constructed in the early years of this century, adds a rural quality; next to the gate the name "Maplehurst" carved in stone shows the owner's pride in this house and attractive site.

William Weld built the house for Daniel Loper from December 1838 until its completion in September 1839. Loper bought the land from Christopher B. Davis. Loper's grandson, Daniel Loper Davis, inherited the property in 1843. He sold it, in 1872, to Charles S. Parker.
