Dormer in the rear roof; vent in the gable.

8. NOTABLE FEATURES

Overhanging eaves; 8/12 sash (appears to be replacement); 6/6 gable windows; plain door frame; stone chimney.

9. ARCHITECTURAL-HISTORICAL

By the middle of the 18th century, Guilford's Colonial houses were usually built with regular symmetrical features. The nine-window front with central doorway, central chimney, and lean-to tucked under an extension of the rear roof slope are telling features of the larger houses of the period. As an epitome of that form, with dark siding and landscaped grounds, this is a noteworthy Colonial house.

The Jonathan Evarts associated with this property probably was a descendant of James or Jonathan, two of the first settlers of this area - A Sgt. Jonathan Evarts (Evets) fought in the "old

French War" circa 1744-45.
